

# Celebrities haunt jail tour

Celebrity spooks will make their presence known at the Second Annual Haunted Squirrel Cage Jail, 226 Pearl St., Saturday from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m.

Persons touring the haunted jail, will have a chance to guess which monster, ghoul or goblin each celebrity portrayed, said Vicky Smith of the Westend Optimists, which is sponsoring the event.

The answers will be kept in a ballot box until Halloween.

The person who has guessed the most celebrity match-ups correctly will receive a cash prize and another chance to see the haunted jail, she said. In case of a tie, the prize will be split among all winners.

At least nine local celebrities have agreed to get into the Halloween spirit, she said.

They include Mayor Thomas P.

Hanafan; Pottawattamie County Sheriff Jefferey D. Danker; Iowa Rep. Brent Siegrist, R-Council Bluffs; Council Bluffs Community School Superintendent Richard H. Christie; and Kari McClure, director of the Convention and Visitor's Bureau.

Also, Sam Curley, Council Bluffs Business Association executive director; Bob Mundt, president of the Council Bluffs Chamber of Commerce; City Councilwoman Sheila Amdor; and Pat McGlade, city council candidate.

The jail will be open Thursday and Sunday from 7 to 10 p.m. and Friday and Saturday from 7 to midnight.

Cost is adults \$3; children 5-11, \$2; and children under 5 or those in special education are free.

Proceeds from the haunted jail will be used to fund the Southwest Iowa Special Olympics, which the club sponsors, and upkeep of the historic jail.
